

MINOR IN ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES AND SOCIAL JUSTICE (5 Courses)

The minor in Environmental Studies and Social Justice is designed to provide undergraduate students with a structured program highlighting the interdisciplinary study of the environment with an emphasis on environmental justice. To fulfill the minor requirements, students must complete three required courses and two elective courses.

Notes:

- *Courses in the minor may also be used to fulfill General Education (Gen. Ed.) requirements (see notation following course title). Depending on a student's major some Gen. Eds. may already be fulfilled.*
- *A minimum of three (3) course-credits (12 semester hours) in the minor must be completed at Framingham State University to meet the residency requirement.*
